Unit 3 Assess Vocational Skills, Knowledge and Understanding

Who is it for?

For practitioners who assess knowledge and/or skills in vocationally-related subject areas who use the following assessment methods: assessments in simulated environments, skills tests, oral and written questions, assignments, projects, case studies and RPL. This may take place in training workshops, classrooms or other learning environments.

The learning outcomes for this unit are:

- Be able to prepare assessment of vocational skills, knowledge and understanding
- Be able to carry out assessments of vocational skills, knowledge and understanding
- Be able to provide required information following the assessment of vocational skills, knowledge and understanding
- Be able to maintain legal and good practice requirements when assessing vocational skill, knowledge and understanding

Assessment of this unit may take place in training workshops, classrooms or other learning environments.

There must be evidence to cover all of the assessment methods listed, and a minimum of 3 must be performance evidence

- Assessments of the learner in simulated environments
- Skills tests
- Oral and written questions
- Assignments
- Projects
- Case studies
- Recognising prior learning

Considerable evidence could be generated for this unit in the form of statements and discussions if the candidate assessor attempts either of the following units at the same time as this one:
